Topic: Functional GI

Abstract:

This lecture is a review of the state of science and practice as related to disorders of brain-gut interactions, where promises of new paradigms and interventions are often as exciting as they could sometimes be disappointing in the field trials and the real world. The problems could lie in the irresistible tendency for scientists and practitioners to carve nature at its joints and the difficult to see beyond their own turf. It behoves upon the consultation liaison psychiatrist to do what he/she does, that is to create a greater sum than the parts (they should work to) put together, to bring about hope and real alleviation of distress, of the roughly 1/10 of populations anywhere suffering from various ailments of brain-gut interaction.

Biography:

Arthur Mak is an Associate Professor at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, where he heads the Consultation Liaison Psychiatry services at the Prince of Wales Hospital. He received training in clinical medicine from CUHK and was a fellow at the Harvard Medical School. Dr. Mak's research work is diverse, ranging from psychiatric epidemiology to neuroimaging research on affective disorders and neurodevelopmental disorders. He has secured seven competitive research grants from GRF and HMRF. His work on Functional Dyspepsia was recognized with the Early Stage Investigator recognition award by the American Gastroenterology Association in 2015. Dr. Mak currently coordinates the World Mental Health Surveys- International College Student Projects in Hong Kong.
